

Mathematics 26L Spring 2002 Final Exam Information

The date and location of the final exam are

YOU WILL BE ASKED TO SHOW YOUR DUKE ID AT THE DOOR. YOU WILL NOT BE ALLOWED ENTRANCE INTO THE FINAL EXAM WITHOUT PROPER IDENTIFICATION.

Cheat Sheets: You are permitted to bring one $8\frac{1}{2} \times 11$ sheet of paper with anything on it. You may use both sides but it must be handwritten. No photocopied cheat sheets will be allowed. It is important that your cheat sheet be no bigger than $8\frac{1}{2} \times 11$. Anyone found with a larger cheat sheet or a photocopied cheat sheet will have it confiscated.

Calculators: You will need to use a calculator on this exam. However, you may NOT use a TI-89, a TI-92, or any calculator capable of symbolic differentiation. Any student found attempting to use such a calculator will have it confiscated until the end of the exam and may be dismissed from the exam. Be sure that your calculator is working and has fresh batteries!

Examinable Material: The final exam is comprehensive. You are responsible for all the material covered in the lectures, the lab, the homework, the textbook, and the Coursepack. Please refer to the syllabus to determine the topics covered and what you should study.

Exam Specifics: All Math 26L students take a common final exam. The exam will be graded jointly by all Math 26L instructors.

Your Grade: It is the explicit policy of the Mathematics Department that a student's final course letter grade shall not be more than one letter grade higher than that student's final exam grade. Moreover, the Mathematics Department shall set a mandatory "F" level for this final exam. Any student scoring below this mandatory "F" level on the final exam must receive a final course letter grade of "F."

The Gateway: You cannot receive a letter grade for this course until you pass the Differentiation Gateway. You will receive an incomplete if you have not passed the gateway by Friday, April 26, 2002.
